




# GDP Growth

# Inflation (%)





# Unemployment


(3-month rolling average.%)



(% of GDP)






# Selective Share Price Index (IPSA) (%)








# Quarterly Trade Balance, 2019-2022 (US\$ million)



(LME, monthly average, US\$/lb)






# Exchange Rate



Background

#### Four main geographic areas with different economic activities:

- North (Atacama Desert): mining, principally copper and nitrates
- Central Valley, with Santiago (capital and seat of government) and Valparaíso (port and seat of Congress): manufacturing, agriculture, wine production and agribusiness
- South: forestry, salmon farming, fishing, agriculture and, in Concepción, petrochemicals and steel production
- Fjords and Tierra del Fuego: tourism, agriculture, fishing, gas and oil production, coal mining.

Population: 19,8 millones (2022)

Language: Spanish

Literacy: 96.4% (2017)

Poverty: 13.7% (2020)

Life expectancy: 79.7 years



### Macroeconomic Framework

Background

### Monetary Policy:

Autonomous Central Bank, responsible for means of payment and price level
Inflation-targeting policy: 2%-4% over 24-month horizon

Overnight interest rate set in nominal terms at monthly monetary policy meeting.

### Fiscal Policy:

Structural fiscal rule in force since 2001

Government spending tied to structural (non-cyclical) income

Non-cyclical income calculated on basis of trend growth and expected copper price over next ten years (both estimated by committee of independent experts).



### Macroeconomic Framework

Background

### Exchange Rate Policy:

Floating exchange rate since 1999

Central Bank retains right to intervene directly in foreign currency market in case of severe fluctuations

No capital controls.

### **Trade Policy:**

Open economy

26 trade agreements with 64 countries, including Free Trade Agreements with main trading partners

Flat-rate tariff of 6% on imports from other countries.

### FDI Policy:

DL 600 Foreign Investment Statute: investors sign individual contract with state of Chile \*

Semi-integrated tax system: Corporate tax serves as credit against withholding tax

Double taxation avoidance agreements in force with 25 countries.




